### FROM THE CHAIR

As we enter the Advent season, there is much happening in our Cursillo community. First of all I extend a warm welcome to our newest members, the Cursillistas from Cursillo weekends 105 and 106. I sincerely hope by now you are firmly planted in your Fourth-Day: grouping, attending Ultreyas, and working to change your individual environments for Christ.

In the last issue of the *Forward* I talked about the key elements of sponsorship. If you are considering sponsoring someone for the Spring Cursillo weekends, now is the time to begin preparation. Before you discuss Cursillo with a potential candidate, I recommend talking to your rector or vicar first. Your priest has tremendous insight on all the members of the congregation; make sure you're both on the same page before committing to sponsor someone who might not be appropriate for the weekend.

As we approach the New Year, your Secretariat will be transitioning with new members. I want to thank the outgoing members for all their work and dedication to the movement. Doug Woods has been a key person ensuring the smooth operation of the Three-day Weekends, Eileen Pierce and Dn. Fred Wood have been invaluable in the Pre-Cursillo and candidate selection process, and Fr. Tom Bond has been a steady guiding light as our Diocesan Spiritual Director. Fr. Josh Acton has been appointed by Bishop Hughes to be the new Diocesan Spiritual Director. He will be assisted by newly elected clergy members Dn. Dee Renner, Fr. George Calvert, and Fr. Russ Martin. Newly elected lay members are Darryl Peralta, Victoria Crofoot, and Jeanette Shelly. I am excited about working with the new team. Welcome to all.

Following the recommendation of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee (NECC), the Secretariat has modified our by-laws to create a minimum two-year term as Chair. In the event the person elected to the Chair is in the last year of his/her term, an additional year will be served.

Also, the position of Vice-Chair has been changed to Chair-Elect. The person elected to Chair-Elect will assume the Chair when the current Chair steps down. We hope this change will provide greater continuity in programs and help us to be more organized. I am honored and humbled to continue as the Secretariat Chair of this wonderful community through 2003.

The National Episcopal Cursillo Seminar (NECS) was held in Seattle in October. San Diego continues to be well represented at the national level. Our own Rev. Maryanne Lacey was elected to the NECC (NEC Committee) as the clergy member representing the Western District, replacing our own Rev. Ned Kellogg. During the seminar, Clint Taylor conducted workshops on Music in Cursillo and Larry and Jeannie Salvadori conducted workshops on Back to the Mountain. BTTM originated in San Diego and now has a national following. Ann Packard led a full-day workshop on the ECLW, ably assisted by Robin Dow and Fr. Ralph Haynes. Stew Dadmun conducted a special interest session on Parish Reps. The NECS is a wonderful place to learn more about the Cursillo movement and network with Cursillistas from dioceses from all over the country. We will be fortunate to have the 2003 NECS here in San Diego next October. I highly encourage all to plan ahead to attend. There is much work to do in preparation for the seminar, so please contact our coordinators, Bob and Janet Shaw, to lend a hand.

On November 20, Bishop Hughes hosted the first Cursillo Information Day for Clergy in our diocese. Approximately 30 clergy from around the Diocese were in attendance to hear an overview of the Cursillo method and experience. Stu Simpson (President of the NECC), The Rev. Tom Bond (Diocesan Spiritual Director), Johnny Reus (Hispanic Chair), and I were presenters at the seminar.

## DO YOU STILL WANT TO RECEIVE THE FORWARD?

Cursillistas as a rule are very generous when it comes to supporting Cursillo with their time, talent and treasure. Occasionally, however, Cursillo runs low on funds. This is one of those times. Cursillo is a completely volunteer run program. We run weekends in the spring and the fall, Hispanic weekends in the fall as well as a Back to the Mountain program purely on donations. Unfortunately, some of the recent weekends have been in the red, either because sponsors forgot to pay or have been unable to pay for their candidates, or because workers have not paid or been unable to pay when they work. As you know, we never keep any candidate from attending because their sponsor is unable to pay or any Cursillistas from working because they are unable to pay.

In addition, we publish the *Forward* and provide it to all Cursillistas. The Cursillo mailing list has grown to the point that just producing and mailing the *Forward* is taking a large toll on our finances. Further, a one-time expense this year will come this Fall. We will be hosting the National Episcopal Cursillo Seminar (NECS) in October. We will be blessed by having the NECS with us this year, but it will cost the community in time, talent and treasure. There are many up-front expenses incurred by having the NECS in our midst. We would hope that you would be willing to support the NECS by your presence in October.

The Secretariat has made two decisions in order to place Cursillo once again in a sound financial position. First, if you are able, **please pray about how much and make a contribution to Cursillos in Christianity.** Second, if you want to continue to receive the *Forward* in the mail, it is requested that you send a donation of \$10 to cover postage and printing for the year. If you cannot afford the mailing fees but want to still receive the *Forward*, as with everything else in Cursillo, it will be provided to you. Because some people cannot afford even this modest amount, if you are able to send more than \$10 for postage and printing, your contribution can be applied to those who cannot pay. Charging for mailing has been a difficult decision for the Secretariat to reach, but we now have well over 1000 people on our mailing list, and the cost of mailing to each one has become prohibitive. Another way to receive the *Forward* for free is to provide us your email address.

We would like to distribute the *Forward* electronically to as many people as possible in order to save money. It is also the fastest way to get information out, including the most current list of team and candidates for Palanca. If you have an email address, please provide it to Dick Mette at dickmette@cox.net. Upon publication, Dick Mette will send you an email reminder when the *Forward* is available on the web. Bring your lunch.

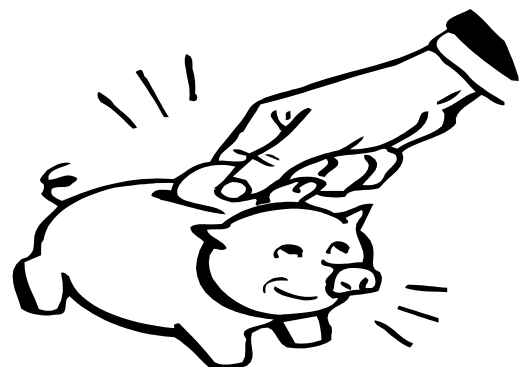

## SPONSORSHIP

"Make a friend, be a friend, bring your friend to Christ". This is the basic process for sponsoring a person to attend a Cursillo Three Day Weekend. Remember hearing this on your weekend? It's been more than twenty years since I made my weekend, but I still remember my sponsors and the process they used - the process we continue to use today.

My sponsors were members of my carpool. There were six members of the carpool, but since many of us traveled on business, there were four among us on a typical trip between our subdivision and downtown Wilmington. Three of the members were active leaders in the local Methodist church.

**Make a friend** - Riding for up to half an hour each way with a group of neighbors for more than five years creates a deep friendship. We shared what was going on in our families, our work and in our churches. We shared each other's joys and sorrows, from the little to the important life events.

**Be a friend** - My sponsors knew that I was active in my parish - Vestry member, Outreach chair, Sunday School teacher - and that I was involved in establishing small groups within our parish to do Bible study. They may have also sensed that I was seeking to grow spiritually. Knowing who I was and where my interest lay, they invited me to attend a Three Day Weekend. While I trusted them and their judgment, I still wanted to know more about this weekend! They answered my questions, without disclosing too much of the weekend that I would experience, and were open about the positive experience the Cursillo movement had on their lives. On the Thursday evening of my weekend, they picked me up at my home and took me to the local church where the bus awaited to take me to the retreat center. They were also at the Clausura - awaiting my reaction to my weekend experience!

**Bring a friend to Christ** - After my weekend, my sponsors invited me to join their Group Reunion. I still remember taking a brown bag lunch to a

conference room in the DuPont Building and feeling unsure - what was this going to be like?? And discussing religion in a corporate conference room?? I met with this group for about a year. By then, there were enough people from my parish to have our own group. My sponsors continued to follow up to see how my new group was getting along and they encouraged me to attend the monthly Ultreyas. The following year, one of my sponsors was the weekend rector and invited me to be part of the Kitchen Crew, which was the beginning of my involvement with the larger Cursillo community. My sponsors sought out a candidate among those in their immediate circle of friends. Who is there that you know, a person leading an active Christian life, that would benefit from attending a Three Day Weekend? The weekend experience is an emotional one and is not recommend for someone going through a period of current personal stress. After prayerfully identifying a potential candidate, share with them your personal experience of the Cursillo Method. Enter into a discussion with them about Cursillo, the weekend and the Fourth Day. Answer their questions as openly and completely as you can. There is support literature to help you - the tri-fold brochure, *Cursillo-A Movement of the Episcopal Church*, and information in the NEC Library.

Your responsibility, as a sponsor, is to provide transportation on the Thursday night and to assure the candidate that things that must be attended to at their home during the weekend are covered. You will also attend the Clausura and provide transportation home. As with my sponsors, your responsibility does not end with the weekend. Your candidate will look to you for assistance in joining a Group Reunion and may need your encouragement to attend Ultreyas. It is a good idea to take them to the first two or three Ultreyas.

Sponsoring a person for a Three Day Weekend can change a person's life direction. My sponsors did that for me. Who will you help along their spiritual journey? Prayerfully consider that question.

## FROM THE RECTOR, #107

**Matthew 14:28-29** And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, bid me come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus.

When I think back on my "moments closest to Christ", many of them involve times when I had to leave my comfort zone and rely totally on His grace and strength. That total dependency - a very hard thing for me - brings about total trust. From trust comes peace. And from peace, joy. It is in that moment that I feel Christ's presence, and His joy in me.

"Where you put your faith" is an integral part of the theme for Cursillo 107. Peter had to step out of the boat before he could walk on the water. He had to leave behind something in which he put his trust every working day of his life, and place that trust in Christ. I remember my trip up the mountain as a new cursillista. I had forgotten to leave my watch at home. When my sponsor reminded me I would not be able to wear it, I slipped it off and put it in my pocket with plans to put it in my suitcase later. But I knew that I would be able to look at it (and WOULD look at it) if I left it there. As the trip continued toward Camp Stevens I came to realize this choice was my first step in deciding if I was going to trust God during this weekend. Was I willing to be totally dependent on these people I didn't know (and through them, dependent on God)? I made the right decision and gave up the watch at check in. From that point on, I decided that I would approach the weekend with faith in Christ. And it worked!

As rector, I find myself once again stepping out in faith. This is not "my" weekend. It is Jesus'. If I try to remain in my comfort zone, in control, our ship will be torn apart by the storm. But if I can keep my eyes on Him, and put my trust in Him, He will work miracles!

Many people describe Peter as rash and impulsive, and often use this verse as an example. I would argue otherwise. In verse 28, Peter asks Christ to call him. In response to Jesus' call, Peter is able to leave his comfort zone and step out in faith. I am asking the same of you. Don't "jump into the water" of volunteering for this Cursillo without asking Christ first - Is He calling you to work the weekend? If so, respond to that call with all the faith and commitment that Peter did.

I guarantee the Holy Spirit will "stretch" you on this weekend. And when He does, you will find a moment closest to Christ. Likewise, don't "push" people overboard, into Cursillo when they aren't ready for it. But prayerfully consider those who may be ready for this "short course" on the water, and then encourage and support them as sponsors.

What a joy it is to serve with you brothers!

## **CANDIDATE APPLICATION**

**CURSILLO** is Spanish for short course in Christian living. The 'short course' consists of a Three-day Weekend and a separate "Fourth Day". A team of laity and clergy present the fundamental principles of Christian living through a series of talks and meditations.

Your sponsor believes you have leadership qualities, and have the potential to change your environments for Christ. The weekend is designed to provide leadership training while reaffirming your commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. After the weekend, there is a continuing program in which you are encouraged to participate.

Since both this weekend and the subsequent involvement are demanding, we ask you to pray seriously about your application before you submit it. Acceptance is not automatic for a specific weekend, but will be prayerfully considered. Once the Pre-Cursillo committee determines the candidate's participation in the upcoming weekend will be beneficial, the candidate will receive notice of acceptance. If your application is accepted, but you are unable to attend the designated weekend, your application will remain active for two upcoming weekends.

In order to gain the most from the weekend, you should be in the best possible spiritual, emotional and physical condition.

Husband and wife should apply at the same time. HUSBAND MAKES CURSILLO FIRST, and the wife makes hers one week later.
