FROM THE CHAIR

Recently, while reading through the proposed resolutions to convention, it became apparent that we are truly a diocese in crisis. Even if I had chosen to ignore the refugees of sister parishes visiting my church, the stark contrast in the proposals drove it home. I mention this because I feel that this is an important time to reiterate that Cursillo is not an issue driven ministry. As written on the national Cursillo web site, "The goal of Cursillo is the goal of the Church: to bring all to Christ. This is done when informed, trained leaders set out with the support of others having a similar commitment." And, borrowing the words of David Rowe, the current president of the National Cursillo, speaking on the same topic in the December issue of the 4th Day Magazine, "This movement is neither liberal nor conservative. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused." With this in mind, I pray that while working within a Cursillo context, we remain focused on the goals of Cursillo. That we continue the mission that we have done so well over the years; teaching Christians to deepen their relationship with Jesus, thus allowing them to share that love with their friends.

Having said that, this is an exciting time in our community. At the end of February, we are hosting our second ECLW in three years. This is a great opportunity for those who are new to the community to see how a Cursillo movement should be run. It is also a wonderful chance for those who have been a part of Cursillo for years to compare notes with those from other Dioceses. We have a first class team coming from national and it promises to be both very educational and spirit filled. After the last ECLW in San Diego, our servant community became massively revitalized and has gone on to do great things. Cursillo, Vision, and Lay Leadership

One of the chief purposes of Cursillo is to make lay leaders for the church. While not every lay person that goes through a Cursillo will actually become a lay leader, still the goal is to enable those with latent leadership ability to become leaders. But what is the key ingredient that makes a leader? It's having the God given vision for a specific group of people and being able to communicate it so that others will follow. A leader must see further than those whom he or she is leading, they must be able to see the future potential that others cannot see. As Konrad Adenaur says, "We all live under the same sky but we don't all have the same horizon." A leader sees a horizon that others do not see but need to see. In the church there are a number of horizons that leaders need to show other people. Leaders must see the vision for our parish, for our diocese, for Cursillo, for any ministry of a group of people. The leader must be convinced that the vision is very important and must be accomplished and communicate it with a contagious spirit to those whom they are leading.

Leadership is not the same thing as being a manager. A leader knows how to bring people into the future by casting a vision, while a manager simply knows how to make things work in the present. A manager does not cast a vision.

The great thing about Cursillo is that through piety and study it helps lay people to see God's vision for various ministries. By praying and studying the Bible and other Christian books, Cursillo helps lay people to see the future that God wants to have come into existence. Learning to see God's vision is what enables leadership in the church to happen. It is not trying to implement your personal vision for the church that will make the church work. A vision from an individual is not a vision from God and will not bring about the future that God intends for the church. The effective leader is the one who sees God's vision and is able to communicate it. The many public speaking opportunities in Cursillo help teach communication skills that are necessary to communicate a God given vision. Most talks that are given in Cursillo events are about casting a vision for other lay people to follow. For example, the Rollos on piety, study, and action are casting a vision of piety, a vision of study, and a vision of action. The speakers are not just speaking, they are leading.

We should remember that the primary vision caster for a parish is the rector, and it is important that lay leaders and the rector share the same vision in common. It does not mean that the lay people have to agree with the rector on every single point of how to implement the vision but it does mean that they have to share the same overall vision. Lay leaders need to cast the vision of the parish in their own particular area of leadership and not drift off into a personal vision.

Cursillo is a marvelous tool that enables lay people first to see God's vision, then to cast that vision for others to see so that lay people can become lay leaders in the church. Cursillo enables lay vision and leadership.

SPONSORSHIP

What did Jesus do when He wanted to bring his gospel to the world? He went out to look for certain types of individuals. He was not being exclusive; he was being practical. He chose leaders, or potential leaders—people who had the potential to influence others. Cursillo works in the same way. Since the goal is to penetrate everyday living situations with Christian witness, it makes sense to try to find those individuals, already active members of their churches, who have the potential to be effective witnesses.

Such individuals will be found in every walk of life, of varying socioeconomic, educational and cultural backgrounds. The important criteria in identifying these people are a willingness and an ability to engage in active Christian witness in the community and openness to God's leading through the Spirit.

Once such persons are identified, they are invited to "make a Cursillo." The purpose of doing so is to provide these persons a common ground with others like themselves for plumbing the depths of their faith.

According to the Cursillo Leader's Manual, the candidate for Cursillo is a baptized Christian, reasonably stable and mature, with a desire for God's love, a longing to be set on fire with zeal to do His work in the church and in the world. We should not invite someone to attend Cursillo just because they seem like a "great person". Before sponsoring a person for Cursillo, we should take a prayerful look at his or her Christian life. Is he or she searching for Christ? Do you see Christ in this person? Does he or she have the potential to see Christ in others? Will this person grow from the Cursillo experience? Cursillo is not intended to be a conversion experience; it is for persons who have a Christian commitment and are looking for a renewal and growth in that commitment.

As sponsors, we have responsibilities to potential candidates for Cursillo, as well as to the Cursillo community. The first thing we should do when considering sponsoring a person for a Cursillo weekend is to pray and ask for God's guidance. Secondly, we should talk with our priest about the person. He or she may know some reasons why this might not be the right person or the right time. Given the priest's blessing, a good way to be able to answer the above questions is to invite this person to our groupings. I truly believe that we should be identifying potential Cursillistas at least 3-6 months in advance of a Three-Day Weekend. By doing so, we can get to

know them better so to be able to answer these questions. They can see first-hand what it means to be living an active Christian life by participating in the grouping activities of piety, study and action. It is only through personal witness that we will make the Cursillo Method attractive to prospective candidates. **Obviously this means that sponsors must be actively involved in grouping.**

The sponsor should explain the weekend, assuring the candidate that they make ask any question they want to know about the weekend. We want candidates to be excited and looking forward to the weekend, not afraid and nervous as a result of little or misleading information.

It is essential that the sponsor send Palanca to the person(s) they sponsor. The best and most appropriate Palanca is a letter telling the candidate of the prayer and selfless acts, such as fasting that are being done for them while they are at the Cursillo weekend. Remember that authentic Palanca is not a "thing", much less a bag of things. What is absolutely essential for the success of any weekend is prayer. This prayer should be deep, intentional and selfless. If it is offered truly for the purpose of the candidate (s), God will surely hear and answer that prayer. This is the best gift that could possibly be given to any Cursillo weekend.

Sponsoring a candidate and working on the team at the weekend one's candidate attends should be avoided if possible; but if unavoidable, a co-sponsor should be found.

Other items that the sponsor should ascertain are:

1. The candidate should be free of family stress, e.g. recent divorce or family deaths. Usually a period of one year from the occurrence of the trauma is suggested.
2. The candidate must be a Christian and, with very few exceptions, an Episcopalian.
3. The candidate should be strongly encouraged to make the Cursillo in the diocese of his or her Christian environment. While we realize this may not always be possible, we feel that the candidates Fourth Day life will be substantially aided by participation within his existing community. If it is not possible, the person's home Secretariat should be notified.
4. When the candidate is married, the sponsor should recommend highly that both husband and wife make a Cursillo because the Cursillo experience is intended to be shared.

The responsibilities of the sponsor during the Cursillo weekend are to:

1. Make sure the candidate packs everything he or she will need for the weekend.
2. Provide transportation to and from the location of the weekend.
3. Arrange to take care of any problems at home that may present themselves over the weekend.
4. Arrange for personal Palanca for the candidate; remember prayer and selfless acts of love are the authentic Cursillo Palanca.
5. Attend the closing and other events including both the candidate and the Cursillo community.

Sponsors are responsible for affording their candidate(s) the opportunity for a Fourth Day life, aiding and encouraging him or her to belong to a permanent Group Reunion and Ultreya. Specifically, the sponsor needs to ensure that the new Cursillista joins an existing group, or if that is not possible, help in establishing a new group. If the sponsor is not willing to do this, they should **not** sponsor a candidate.

In summary, sponsors should:

1. Know the goal of Cursillo
2. Be familiar with who should and who should not make a Cursillo
3. Know the candidate well and support him or her at every stage
4. Be an authentic witness to the Christian life and be active in the Fourth Day
5. Take responsibility for incorporating the Cursillista into the Fourth Day community

Finally of course, sponsors should pray about a candidate **before** inviting him or her to make Cursillo, and constantly before, during and after the Weekend.

CANDIDATE APPLICATION

CURSILLO is Spanish for short course in Christian living. The Cursillo uses a Three-Day Weekend and a separate "Fourth Day" (on a weekend shortly after the women's weekend). A team of laity and clergy will present the fundamental principles of Christian living through a series of talks and meditations.

Your sponsor believes you have leadership qualities and the potential to change your environments for Christ. The weekend is designed to provide leadership training while reaffirming your commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. After the weekend, there is a continuing program in which you are encouraged to participate.

Since both this weekend and the subsequent involvement are demanding, we ask you to pray seriously about your application before you submit it. Acceptance is not automatic for a specific weekend, but will be prayerfully considered. Once the Pre-Cursillo committee determines the candidate's participation in the upcoming weekend will be beneficial, the candidate will receive notice of acceptance. If your application is accepted, but you are unable to attend the designated weekend, your application will remain active for two upcoming weekends.

In order to gain the most from the weekend, you should be in the best possible spiritual, emotional and physical condition. Cursillo is held at Camp Stevens near Julian, which is at 4,400 ft, and is situated on hills. The dining hall is up the hill from the sleeping area. If this presents a problem to you, please explain and we will try to accommodate you.

Husband and wife should apply at the same time. The husband goes to his Three-Day Weekend first, and the wife will attend her weekend one week later. Husbands and wives should complete separate applications.

After completing the application, please give it to your sponsor who will submit it.

Cut-off date for applications is March 15, 2004.
