ULTREYA!

Ultreya is the cry of encouragement used by Spanish pilgrims on their journeys to a pilgrimage site. It means Onward! Forward! Persevere! In the U.S., it is the call to Cursillistas to come together to help each other on their journeys with the Lord.

An Ultreya Committee has been formed with the purpose of holding at least one Ultreya per month in various parts of the diocese. An Ultreya is designed to give personal examples of fellow Christians attempting to follow God's call to make a friend, be a friend, and help bring that friend to Christ. Typically, a potluck, music, grouping, two witnesses, and a clergy scriptural response are parts of an Ultreya.

No worship service is included. Since everyone is welcome, this is the perfect time to introduce prospective candidates to Cursillo.

The committee will contact Parish Representatives to schedule an Ultreya. Using the resources of the parish, with active support from the Ultreya Committee, we will hold an Ultreya, encouraging ALL in the parish community (not just Cursillistas) to participate. If you'd like to be a member of this diverse group of laity and clergy, please contact me. If you'd like to volunteer to hold an Ultreya in your parish or to co-sponsor one at another church, please also let me know. The burdens of life are always lighter when we have someone to help share the load. Join us in an Ultreya!

In August we will hold an Ultreya at St. Luke's on Saturday the 11th. There will be no Ultreya in September because of the ECLW. Watch the website for the October Ultreya (at press time it probably will be at Trinity but we haven't set a date yet). In November we will have a Grand Ultreya (with elections) at St. Paul's, San Diego.

"Who is my Neighbor?" A Commentary on the Parable of the Good Samaritan by Ted Parsons

Sometimes I have wondered if I should give money to a homeless person or beggar. What about the people in front of grocery stores? Do they represent worthy causes? Now, when I see homeless people, I give a dollar to each one. Well, not exactly. I have given envelopes with my church name, Good Shepherd, on it (and money inside)! Now I have no envelopes. So I give a dollar in cash and say God bless you! And I have a short conversation while waiting for the light to change. Unfortunately, I do not always have a dollar or even change in my car. So I feel guilty. Yet, I do not feel guilty long. My heart is in the right place. And then I put more change in the car and dollars in my wallet. Long ago I answered the argument about giving to drunks or homeless people who spend my money on liquor or cigarettes. My motivation has to be giving to someone in need. I am not going to judge them. They're human beings too; they are my neighbors.

Another neighbor is a barber. She is a new neighbor as of two weeks ago. I was referred to this person. She bought a salon and added the barber service a year ago. I asked if she had owned a place before. She asked why would you say that? "Well, you are good!" Her excellent service encouraged me to give a tip. Then I gave another dollar. I never do that! Then she showed me a jar where she puts change for a minister in the jar. So I gave another dollar! All this happened within 30 minutes with a stranger. By the way, her name is Lenora. And I am taking my wife when she needs a haircut!

Recently I had a new adult student join one of my classes. She is in her 40's, and she was living with her brother and sister-in-law. In each class, Hanan asked excellent questions and participated fully in the class. I found out that she had moved from Egypt to stay, get a job, and a place to live. Well, as the weeks went by, she shared with me that her sister-in-law did not want her living with her. Then I realized I knew people who rented homes or apartment. I asked and both people had places available! Wow! I copied the information and give it to Hanan. She was delighted.

Unfortunately, her brother would not advance her rent money and Hanan still did not have a job. She kept applying but no anyone would call her back or give her a job. By the way, she has a green card, graduated from university, and is a practicing attorney in Egypt. Then I asked three attorney friends of mine for advice and information. All of this I also gave to Hanan and urged her to call companies or search the Internet. Unfortunately, by this time, Hanan had given up. Her home life was nonexistent with her brother and sister-in-law. Her mom in Egypt is quite ill. So, she returned to Egypt this week, on Wednesday. Did I say she is Muslim? Her father was a Christian and her mom a Muslim.

My birthday was last Monday. My students gave a complete surprise party for me. They sang Happy Birthday in English, Spanish, and Arabic! Hanan sang a solo. Then she ended with saying the two best things in her short stay in the United States were being part of the class and meeting me. Wow! Well, she is my neighbor as well.
