Hello all,

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The Church, the Community Created By the Holy Spirit

It is so easy to forget that the church is not an institution created by human beings; it was created in one day, the day of Pentecost in 30 AD by the Holy Spirit—the birthday of the church. No one had ever seen a church before, but God the Holy Spirit gathered a diverse group of devout Jews from many nations in Jerusalem and made them into one community, one people by the miraculous work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit enabled them to speak and understand each other's languages, see Acts, Chapter 2. The Spirit gathered and formed them into the church. The church is the creation of the Holy Spirit.

So often we look around the church and see sinful and even eccentric human beings and we fail to see the miraculous work of the Spirit. We forget that the church began by a miracle of the Spirit and runs today by the Spirit's miracles. While we humans work in the church, most of the work is really being done by the Holy Spirit. We can trick ourselves into thinking that we are doing most of the work. If we are doing most of the work then the church will fail because all successful churches are open to the work of the Holy Spirit. It's the Spirit's working through the people, that's what is most important.

Let's look at some of the miracles of the Spirit in the church. First of all we see that the presence of Christ's resurrection is poured into the church by the Holy Spirit. If the Holy Spirit was not in the church then we would read about Jesus' resurrection in the New Testament as if it was just another story from ancient history. But the Holy Spirit is in the church, and we experience Christ's resurrection as a living reality today, that's the work of the Holy Spirit, that's a miracle. And because through the Spirit Christ's risen life is in the church, the church is the community of Christ on earth. The church is not just a community that remembers what Jesus did 2,000 years ago, the church in the power of the Spirit does today what Jesus did when He was on earth, heal the sick, forgive sins, preach the good news, and bring people into God's kingdom. Through the Holy Spirit the church is the community of Christ.

Now let's look at some more miracles of the Spirit in the church.

When the Bible is read, many people do not just hear the human words of an ancient text, they hear God speak to them through the text. The Holy Spirit turns the words of the text into the living

word of God for us today. This is a miracle! And only a miracle could enable us to hear God speak to us, to hear His true and living word.

Another means of the miraculous working of the Holy Spirit is the seven Sacraments. The Spirit comes to us through material things, for example through the waters of Baptism and through the bread and wine of communion. The Spirit works a miracle through the water of Baptism giving us the gift of membership in Christ's church. The Spirit works a miracle in the bread and wine of communion giving us the body and blood of Christ, a means to encounter the life of Christ. Each Sacrament involves the miraculous work of the Spirit through material things.

Yet another kind of miracle is the gifts of the Holy Spirit—the spiritual gifts given for ministry. Every Christian is given at least one spiritual gift, to be used in ministry for building up the church. Gifts of teaching, service, administration, healing, and hospitality are just a few examples. In the New Testament there are a total of 27 gifts listed, many of them are in three lists located in Romans 12, I Corinthians 12, and Ephesians 4. All these gifts operate in the church under the power of the Holy Spirit. It is a miracle that God raises up people to use these gifts to minister to other people. Most people would not do these things if left to their selfish inclinations. It is the Holy Spirit that leads and empowers us to share our gifts with others. And when these gifts are performed in the power of the Spirit everyone enjoys it. There is a blessing on the person using his or her gift as well as on the people receiving the gift.

In the church we are surrounded by the miracle of God's Word, the Sacraments and Spiritual Gifts. Everywhere you turn in the church there is a miracle of the Holy Spirit. It may be the person sitting next to you in the pew; it may be a miracle for that person to even be in the church. Everywhere the Holy Spirit is at work.

The church is not just a human institution, it is not our church, it is Christ's church and He is the one who sent the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost to create it. And Jesus Christ still sends the Holy Spirit today to run His church. It is our job to be open to the work of the Spirit and co-operate with the Holy Spirit. Let us pray "Come Holy Spirit and do your miraculous work among us."

THE SERVANT COMMUNITY

It has been said that the Secretariat is the "brains" of the Diocesan Cursillo Movement. The Servant Community is its heart. It functions in four important ways:

It is a growing community in Christ that is a witness to the larger community of what a Christian Community in Action can be.

It is a school to deepen the knowledge and commitment of already mature Cursillo Leaders in their Life in Grace and the Cursillo Method as these are related to a) The Diocesan Pastoral Plan worked out between the Bishop and the Secretariat and b) The needs of our Cursillo Community.

It is a source of ideas to the Secretariat about what will carry out the will of the Holy Spirit within our diocesan Cursillo Community.

It is a group of servant leaders who, under the direction of the Secretariat, carry out the tasks of the diocesan Cursillo Community within the diocese in order to build up the Body of Christ.

All of the functions of our diocesan Cursillo Community are divided into committees and subcommittees. Members self select the areas of activity which they feel called to serve. The full Servant community meets four times a year; on the second Saturday of the month, nine till noon in the sanctuary of the Church of the Good Samaritan in University City. There is music, a clergy and lay talk related to leadership within the community, grouping from the Leaders' Grouping Card, and meeting of the committees and subcommittees to discuss their accomplishments of the past three months and any suggestions they may have for the Secretariat. Before the meeting closes each group presents a summary of its meeting to the whole group. The full Servant Community decides on what will be presented to the Secretariat together with any recommendations it wishes the Secretariat to carry out.

A representative from the Servant Community carries the Servant Community recommendations to the Secretariat meeting that begins after lunch on the same Saturday. Secretariat members attending the earlier Servant Community meeting can comment on these recommendations.

Most of the business of the individual Servant Community committees and subcommittees takes place in person, by phone and by email in between the full Servant Community meetings. All Cursillistas who feel called to assist the mission of the Cursillo Movement in our diocese are welcome to attend Servant Community meetings and to participate fully in what happens there. CANDIDATE APPLICATION

CURSILLO is Spanish for short course in Christian living. The Cursillo method uses a Three-Day Weekend and a separate "Fourth Day" (on a weekend shortly after the women's weekend). A team of laity and clergy will present the fundamental principles of Christian living through a series of talks and meditations.

Your sponsor believes you have leadership qualities and the potential to change your environments for Christ. The weekend is designed to provide leadership training while reaffirming your commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. After the weekend, there is a continuing program in which you are encouraged to participate.

Since both this weekend and the subsequent involvement are demanding, we ask you to pray seriously about your application before you submit it. Acceptance is not automatic for a specific weekend, but will be prayerfully considered. Once the Pre-Cursillo committee determines the candidate's participation in the upcoming weekend will be beneficial, the candidate will receive notice of acceptance. If your application is accepted, but you are unable to attend the designated weekend, your application will remain active for two upcoming weekends.

In order to gain the most from the weekend, you should be in the best possible spiritual, emotional and physical condition. Cursillo is held at Camp Stevens near Julian, which is at 4,400 ft, and is situated on hills. The dining hall is up the hill from the sleeping area. If this presents a problem to you, please explain and we will try to accommodate you.

Husband and wife should apply at the same time. The husband goes to his Three-Day Weekend first, and the wife will attend her weekend one week later. Husbands and wives should complete separate applications.

After completing the application, please give it to your sponsor who will submit it.
